¹ Lassallea is named after Ferdinand Lassalle, and Ottensen was a working class district in Hamburg with a vibrant labor movement.

² Fritz Reuter (1810-1874): German writer from Mecklenburg. At the University of Jena, he joined a liberal student group "Germania" advocating political freedom and German national unification. The group organized emonstrations and revolutionary lectures. The government cracked down on all radical students and Reuter was arrested and imprisoned for crimes against the Prussian state.
